**Day 1 Dutch Country Arrival & Tour**

Depart by **private motorcoach** for **Lancaster County, the heart of Pennsylvania Dutch Country**. The Pennsylvania Dutch people are descendants of German immigrants that settled in Pennsylvania in the early 1700's. The most well-known Pennsylvania Deutsch are the Amish, a religious people that stress humility, family, community, and separation from the world. Although the Amish are a diverse community, the Old Order Amish all drive horses and buggies, do not have electricity in their homes, and send their children to private, one-room schoolhouses. At home and in their community, most Amish speak a dialect of German, originally known as Pennsylvania Deutsch; they study High German for worship services. Arrive in Lancaster late this morning and meet your **local Amish guide for a tour of Pennsylvania Dutch Country**. You will learn more about the German heritage of the local people and **visit an authentic working Amish farm**. Stop for lunch (at your own expense) during the tour at a local market. Later, enjoy an up-close **tour of historic Amish farmlands in a horse-drawn buggy ride**. Conclude your day with a **hearty, family style dinner** with your group at a local restaurant – feast on Pennsylvania Dutch specialties, like baked country ham, mashed potatoes, roast beef, fried chicken, baked country sausage, noodles, chow chow, pork and sauerkraut, homemade bread, and shoo fly pie. After dinner, enjoy group activities at the **Laserdome**, a high-tech fun park with laser tag, virtual reality and the Laser Theater. **Overnight in the Lancaster County area.**

**Day 2 PA Dutch Sightseeing & Return**

Following **breakfast at your hotel**, check out and depart for more sightseeing and group activities in Pennsylvania Dutch Country. Transfer to the the **Landis Valley Museum**, a living history museum that collects, preserves, exhibits, and interprets Pennsylvania Dutch heritage and culture. The museum has more than 40 historic structures located on 100 acres, and costumed guides will explain the Pennsylvania Dutch traditions, folklore, traditional crafts, and cooking. You will also enjoy a **hands-on workshop** to explore in-depth one aspect of the Pennsylvania Dutch culture. After time for lunch, **tour the Sturgis Pretzel House**, where you will twist your own pretzel at the oldest pretzel house in America! Depart on your return trip home this evening by **private motorcoach**. Dinner at your own expense on the return trip.
