Day 1 Plymouth, Mayflower, Plimoth Plantation, Dinner & Evening Activity

Depart early this morning by **chartered motorcoach** for the Boston area (rest stop en route). On arrival, enjoy a visit to the coastal town of **Plymouth**, where the pilgrims' voyage across the Atlantic ended at Plymouth Rock. You will also **visit Plimoth Plantation**, a living history museum that shows the original settlement of Plymouth Colony by the Pilgrims. Here you will also tour the **Mayflower II**, a full-scale reproduction of the original Mayflower ship. Continue on to Boston metro area and check into your hotel. After time to freshen up, transfer to the North End neighborhood for **dinner** with your group at an Italian restaurant. Tonight, enjoy an **evening activity** (sporting event possible such as Celtics or Bruins game – pending schedule and confirmation). **Overnight in the Boston area.**

Day 2 Boston's Freedom Trail Tour, Faneuil Hall, Free Time & Ghost Tour

After **breakfast at your hotel**, transfer to center city for a **guided tour of Boston's Freedom Trail** – learn about the people, places, and events in Boston that helped shape the American Revolution. Your tour will feature **visits to Paul Revere House, Old North Church, Old State House, Boston Common, Old Granary Cemetery, Bunker Hill Monument, and King's Chapel**. This afternoon, enjoy some time for additional group activities and shopping at the Faneuil Hall marketplace. Have **dinner** with your group tonight at the *Union Oyster House* (pending final confirmation), followed by a **Haunted Boston Ghost Tour** – step through the shadows and hear enchanting and chilling tales of the city's most famous ghosts! **Overnight in the Boston area.**

Day 3 Harvard University Tour, Lexington & Concord, Return Trip

After **breakfast**, check out and transfer to Cambridge for a **tour of Harvard University**, the oldest institution of higher learning in the United States. Have time for and last-minute souvenir shopping and lunch on your own, then re-board your motorcoach and transfer west of Boston for a **Revolutionary War battleground tour of Lexington & Concord**. You will see **Lexington Battle Green** and the Old North Bridge, where the militia faced off against British Regulars. You will also visit sights central to the start of the American Revolution, including **Minuteman National Historical Park**, where you can walk the Battle Trail, the **National Heritage Museum**, celebrating American history and culture, and **Old Manse**, home of minister William Emerson, his grandson Ralph Waldo Emerson, and the honeymoon home of Nathaniel and Sophia Hawthorne. After the tour, depart on your return trip home. A fast-food dinner stop will be made (at your own expense). A late evening return is expected.
