Day 1 Coach to Montreal

Assemble with your group this afternoon and transfer to Montreal by **private chartered motorcoach**. A rest stop for dinner (at your own expense) will be made en route. On arrival, transfer to your hotel for check in. **Overnight in Montreal.**

Day 2 Montreal City Tour

After **breakfast at your hotel**, check out and depart on a **guided tour of Montreal**. Montreal is a diverse metropolis, home to more than 80 ethnic communities from five continents. Begin with a tour of the modern heart of the city - drive past Place Ville-Marie, McGill University, Chinatown, and the Square Mile neighborhood. Continue on a **walking tour of Old Montreal**, a unique historical district dating back to the 17th century, and **visit Notre Dame Basilica**, a Montreal landmark and masterpiece of neo-Gothic architecture. Later today, stop at **Olympic Park**, site of the 1976 Summer Olympics, where you will see the Olympic Stadium and Biodome. Return to the old city late this afternoon and enjoy an early **dinner** with your group. After dinner, transfer to Quebec City. **Overnight in Quebec.**

Day 3 Ice Hotel & Quebec Tour

Travel outside Quebec this morning to Duchesnay Ecotourism Station, on the shores of Lac St-Joseph, and **visit the Quebec Ice Hotel**. Return to the old city later this morning and have some time for lunch on your own. Then, meet your local guide for a **walking tour of Quebec City**, where the narrow, cobblestone streets are lined with 17th and 18th century buildings. You will see the Place d'Armes, Quartier Petit-Champlain, Place Royale, the Vieux Port, and the Chateau Frontenac, an imposing green-turreted castle which towers over the old city. Once the administrative and military headquarters of New France, the castle today houses a luxury hotel. **Dinner** tonight with your group in the old city. **Overnight in Quebec City.**

Day 4 Carnaval Festivities

Today is free to enjoy the **festivities of the Quebec City Winter Carnival**, including a visit to the Bonhomme's Ice Palace, the sugar shack, snow sculpture show, ice skating, and snow rafting! You will also have time for **toboggan rides on les Glissades de la Terrasse**, and souvenir shopping in the old city. After **dinner**, enjoy the **Carnaval Night Parade**. **Overnight in Quebec City.**

Day 5 Beaupre Coast & Valcartier Village

This morning, depart on an excursion along the St-Lawrence Beaupre Coast, including **Montmorency Falls, the Basilica of Ste-Anne-de-Beaupre, the open-air bread ovens of Chez Marie, and the Albert Gilles Copper Museum**. This afternoon, arrive at the **Valcartier Village des Sports**, where you will have lunch and enjoy an afternoon of snow activities, including crazy carpet ice slides, ice skating, snow rafting, innertube snow sliding, and "Tornado" tube sliding. **Dinner and overnight in Quebec City.**

Day 6 Return

Check out of your hotel this morning and depart for home by **private chartered motorcoach**. A lunch stop (at your own expense) will be made en route.
